WASTE PAPER

- File folders (without metal)
- Egg boxes
- Notebooks (without plastic cover)
- Magazines
- Cardboard boxes
- Catalogues (without plastic cover)
- Clean pizza boxes
- Copy paper
- Fruit cups (cardboard)
- Paper bags
- Paper carrier bags
- Paper packaging (coated, with label 'folded for waste paper')
- Boxes
- Freezer packaging (coated cardboard)
- Corrugated board
- Leaflets (without plastic cover)
- Newspapers, newsprint paper, magazines



COLOURLESS GLASS PACKAGING

- Colourless bottles (glass)
- Colourless glass bottles (disposable)
- Colourless preserves jars
- Colourless cosmetics packaging and bottles (glass)
- Colourless jam jars
- Other glass jars



Please ONLY put white glass in the white glass container. Just one green bottle is enough to turn 500 kg of glass green.

Drinks glasses, ceramic tableware and vases are not packaging and should be placed in residual waste.



STAINED GLASS PACKAGING

- Stained glass
- Coloured bottles (glass)
- Coloured glass bottles (disposable)
- Coloured preserves jars
- Coloured cosmetics packaging and bottles (glass)
- Coloured medicine bottles



Improperly disposed of colourless glass discolours stained glass and diminishes the quality for recycling.

Drinks glasses, ceramic tableware and vases are not packaging and should be placed in residual waste.



LIGHTWEIGHT AND METAL PACKAGING

- Blister packs
- Chip bags
- Buckets (empty, packaging)
- Bottles, vials, flasks (ceramic)
- Meat trays (styrofoam, plastic)
- Plastic film (packaging)
- Corks
- Plastic cups (packaging, with leftovers)
- Plastic packaging
- Nets (e.g., for fruits and vegetables)
- Foam packaging
- Crates (wood), single-use
- Styrofoam chips, packaging
- Tetra Pak
- Tubes (plastic, empty)
- Vacuum packaging
- Aluminum foil
- Beer caps, screw caps (metal)
- Paint and spray cans (completely empty)
- Yogurt cup lids
- Coffee capsules (or return point)
- Coffee packaging
- Canned food
- Aluminum meal trays
- Tubes (metal)



BIO-WASTE

- Tree trimmings (shredded)
- Flowers, flower scraps
- Eggshells
- Food scraps
- Garden waste
- Grass, grass clippings
- Coffee grounds and tea leaves
- Kitchen waste
- Leaves and branches
- Food scraps
- Fruit and vegetable scraps
- Lawn clippings
- Twigs (shredded)
- Bark
- Food scraps
- Shrub trimmings
- Tea bags, filters
- Houseplants



RESIDUAL WASTE

- Tarps
- Aluminum foil (heavily soiled)
- Ash (coal, coke) – cold
- Baking paper
- Lead crystal glass
- Flower pots
- Buckets (household buckets, no packaging)
- Wet wipes
- Meat scraps, bones
- Photos
- Paper beverage cups
- Glassware (e.g., drinking glasses)
- Light bulbs (no energy-saving bulbs)
- Hair, household trash
- Hygiene products (used)
- Damaged clothing, shoes
- Cat litter
- Ballpoint pens
- Paper towels
- Plastic toys
- Greasy pizza boxes
- Receipts (thermal paper)
- Used napkins & tissues
- Mirrors
- Vacuum cleaner contents
- VBC cups
- Diapers
- Cigarette packs
